A trial run proved successful, and TARC was granted the contract. Since the first order was placed in May 2012, TARC's Bayou Packers have delivered good quality parts ahead of schedule or on time and without a single reject. Furthermore, TARC Bayou Packers worker, Thomas LeBouef, manufactures the centralizer rings by hand on poka-yoked fixturing. Thomas quickly mastered the part and looks forward to every order. "I love cutting the wires and bending them", said Thomas. VMTA provided explicit visual work instructions that easily and accurately convey the part requirements and manufacturing process. Mike Blanchard, plant manager at VMTA Houma, feels "the centralizer ring business seems like the right direction for everyone concerned and we look forward to future success in partnership with TARC."
