

Art of Respect

During the week of April 7-11, several local stakeholders sponsored "The Art of Respect", a part of the national campaign to "Spread the Word to End the Word" with the goal of creating and supporting a strong culture of friendship and respect for Louisiana Citizens and showing leadership to create positive social change in our communities. Stakeholders involved in this process included the South Central Louisiana Human Services Authority – Developmental Disabilities Division and Terrebonne ARC and other agencies in our region.

The focus of "The Art of Respect" hopes to end the use of the word "retardation" when describing or referring to persons with a developmental disability. We hope to encourage our communities to respect and recognize the value of all persons regardless of their abilities whether they are physical, emotional or developmental.

The agencies hosted "Art of Respect" in which guests created individual pieces of art that represent respect, acceptance and inclusion. Following the event, a local community artist assessed all art work, selected pieces for individual display and created a large composite piece of art that travels to our local agencies.

The Terrebonne Parish event was held on April 10th at the Dumas Auditorium in collaboration with the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government. We appreciate all the support we received for this event.
