

# CEDAR CHEST EXPANSION TARC OPENS DONATION CENTER SITE, ADDS 3RD DONATION CREW & CELEBRATES 10 YEARS

The Cedar Chest enterprises continue to be the largest part of TARC's vocational program, consisting of four Cedar Chest Boutique thrift stores, three Donation Crews which service 17 community donation bins in addition to the stores, and a Donation Center which provides a sedentary setting to process donations. By year-end, the Cedar Chest family employed 20 DSW staff and 43 individuals.

TARC moved the Thrift Processing unit on campus to its community location at 6259 W. Main St. during the month of June. The new location, renamed the Donation Center, opened its' doors on 6/25/18 and provided community integration for 8 individuals. This enterprise is served by the Donation Crews and all items processed for retail are sent to the four Cedar Chest stores on a rotating basis.

Cedar Chest West (on Enterprise Drive) celebrated its' 10-year anniversary on April 22, 2018. The store held multiple sales throughout the week of April 23-27 to show appreciation for all of the customer support in the past ten years. Thank you for the continued support!
