This past year has been more about the continued recovery from Hurricane IDA, getting CARF Re-Accredited and moving forward with improving services, businesses and partnering with our local school district. Unfortunately, TARC has had to seek legal action against our property insurance company in order to get reimbursed for the many thousands of dollars owed to us for IDA damages. This is an on-going battle. CARF surveyors came and went with many accolades and compliments regarding our "TIGHT SHIP" operation and excellent services. TARC is accredited for another 3-year period and we are happy with the five-star rating!

In addition, TARC Administration and Board of Director's moved forward in acquiring the "OLD" bank building on East Tunnel for the Cedar Chest Thrift Processing Crew to call home. It is much bigger and will allow more individuals to work in the future.

TARC's Division 3 director and our Community Employment Staff, wrote a pilot program for the Terrebonne Parish School District to partner with TARC, in educating the four high school principals, guidance counselors, and special education teachers of those schools, on the process of applying for services, for students 18-22, who exit the school system. The process will assist school personnel, parents and students on how to seek training at TARC and/or job placement in the community through the Office for Citizens with Developmental Disabilities and/or Louisiana Rehabilitation Services. The cooperation with Terrebonne's school superintendent and the special education department has been exciting and will be rewarding for those who wish to participate.
